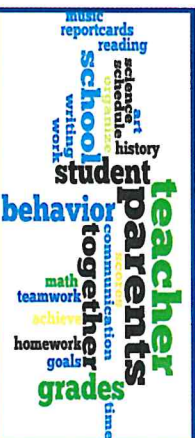

- Increase the number of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Georgia Milestones End of Course Assessments in all core subjects by 10%.
- Decrease the total number of student absences more than 6 days or 5%.
- Increase opportunities for family and community engagement.
